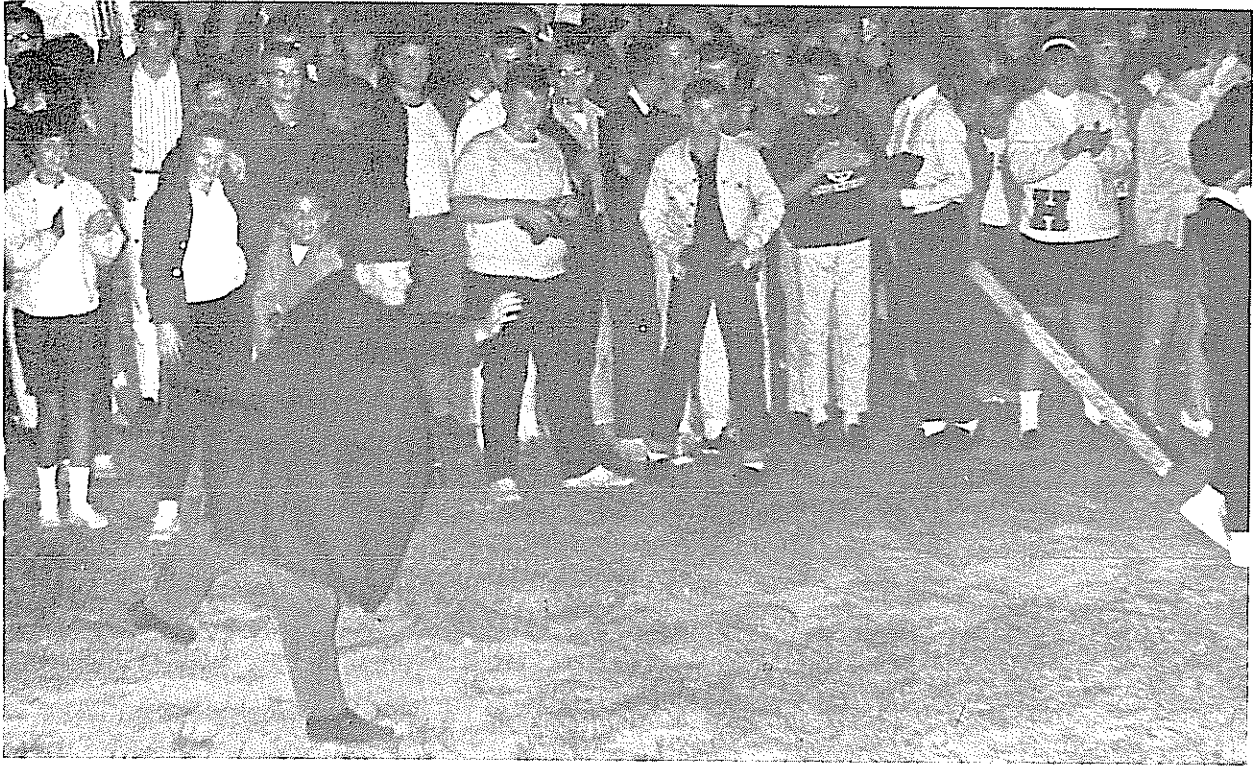

The mathematics program in the city school system, which has been the focus of much attention during this past year, is scheduled for a change by next fall. A new method of mathematics teaching, which has swept the country since the space age began in the late 1950's, is being adopted in Delaware. The major innovations of the new program are: new or advanced terminology; careful explanation of why processes are done rather than sheer memorization of rules; unified courses of study in which each phase is advanced through each successive year; and use of practical applications such as word problems. The benefits of the "new math" are many: greater understanding, increased interest by the student in other subjects as well as mathematics, and greater subject matter covered.

Auto Mechanics



Automotive mechanics is a two-year course open to eleventh and twelfth grade students. This course covers the theory of operation and construction, maintenance, repair, and adjustments of automotive components. Five hundred and forty hours of shopwork and two hundred hours of related classroom work per year are required. After completion of the course, the students are well on their way to becoming skilled automotive mechanics.

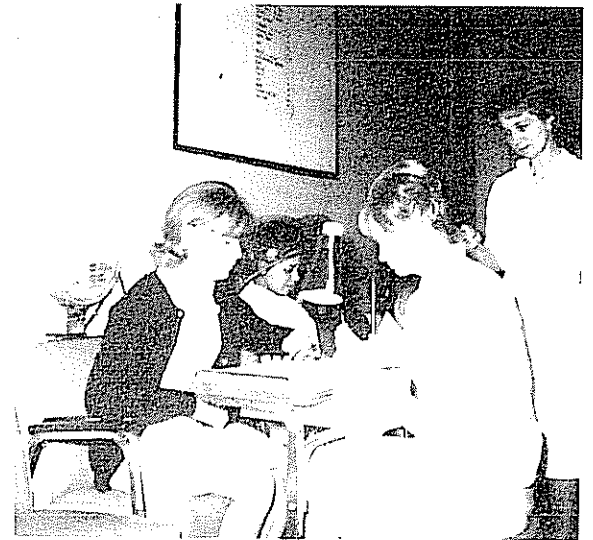

Cosmetology is a two-year course open to Juniors. Classwork consists of four and one-half hours per day of theoretical as well as practical studies. Theoretical studies include lessons in sanitation, sterilization, anatomy, mathematics, chemistry, bookkeeping, telephone techniques and personality training. The practical skills are hair cutting, styling, tinting, bleaching, permanent waving, manicuring, facials and make-up techniques. When the student has completed the course, she is eligible to take the Ohio Cosmetology State Board Examination, which gives her a license to practice cosmetology in Ohio.

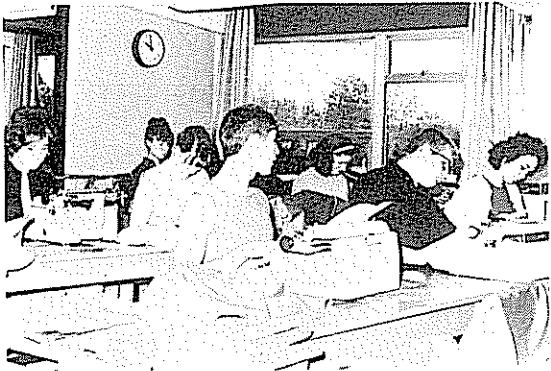

The occupational education program is under the direction of Mr. Rolla M. Beach. It is a three phase program, the primary responsibility being work experiences. Phase 1 is the classroom program. This deals with preparing students to take part in the working world, including proper fillings of an application blank, employec-employer job interviews, discussing and learning about jobs. These areas are incorporated through the following academic courses: functional mathematics, language arts, social studies and practical science. Nonacademic courses available are Home-Ec, physical ed., wood shop, metal shop, music, art and typing. In related occupations and social behavior, Mr. Ray Middleton works in conjunction with Mr. Beach. Phase 2 is the training program. This makes jobs available to the students within the school. Here they get basic training and advice from the coordinator to prepare them for job placement. Phase 3 is the job placement. Here selected students are placed in jobs in institutions, industries and businesses outside of the school system, in the Delaware area. Pupils are paid for their work, and become prepared to take their place in the adult working world.

The Pacers' Rick Reed was named to the second team of the All Central Buckeye League Team while Phil Reed and Steve Courter were given honorable mention by the coaches.

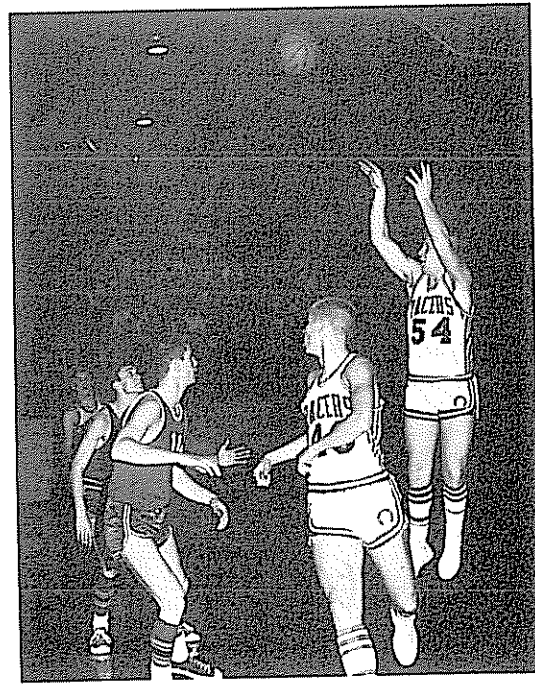

In the C.B.L. meet Joe McKay and Mike Ford advanced to the finals. This fine showing indicates a bright future for this sport at Hayes.

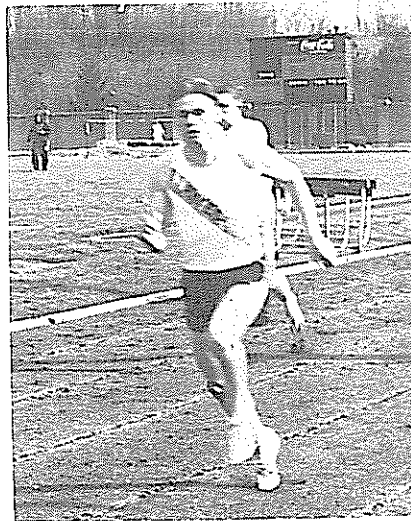

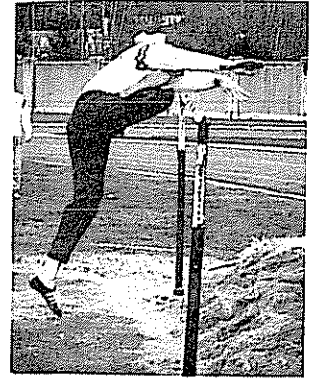

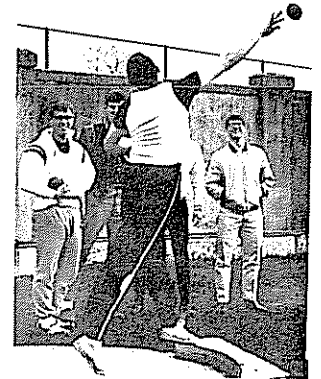

The Pacers' prospects for next year look bright despite the loss of six seniors. Several potentially good freshmen and sophomores are returning along with three juniors.



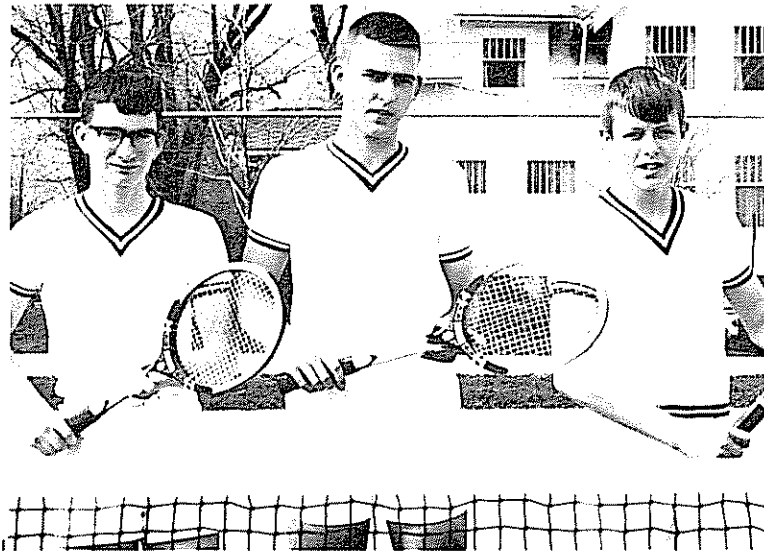

H-Teens

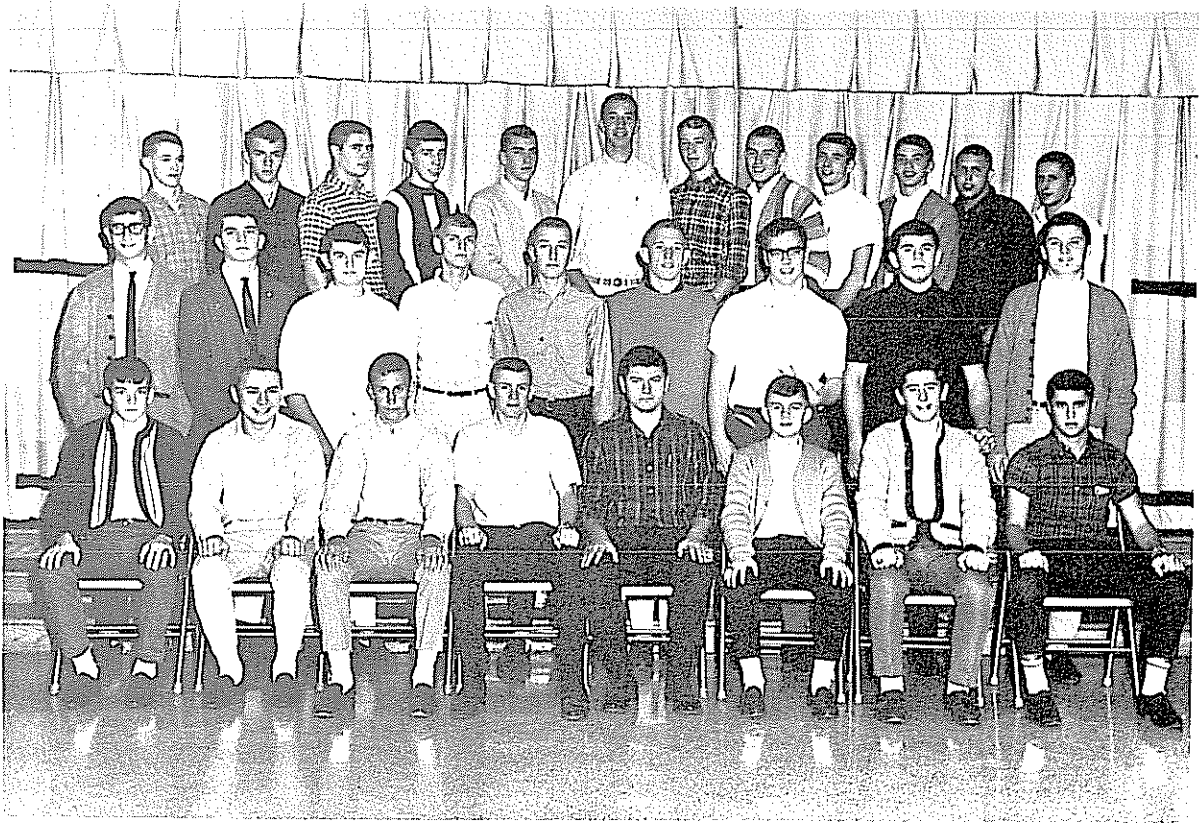

French and German Clubs

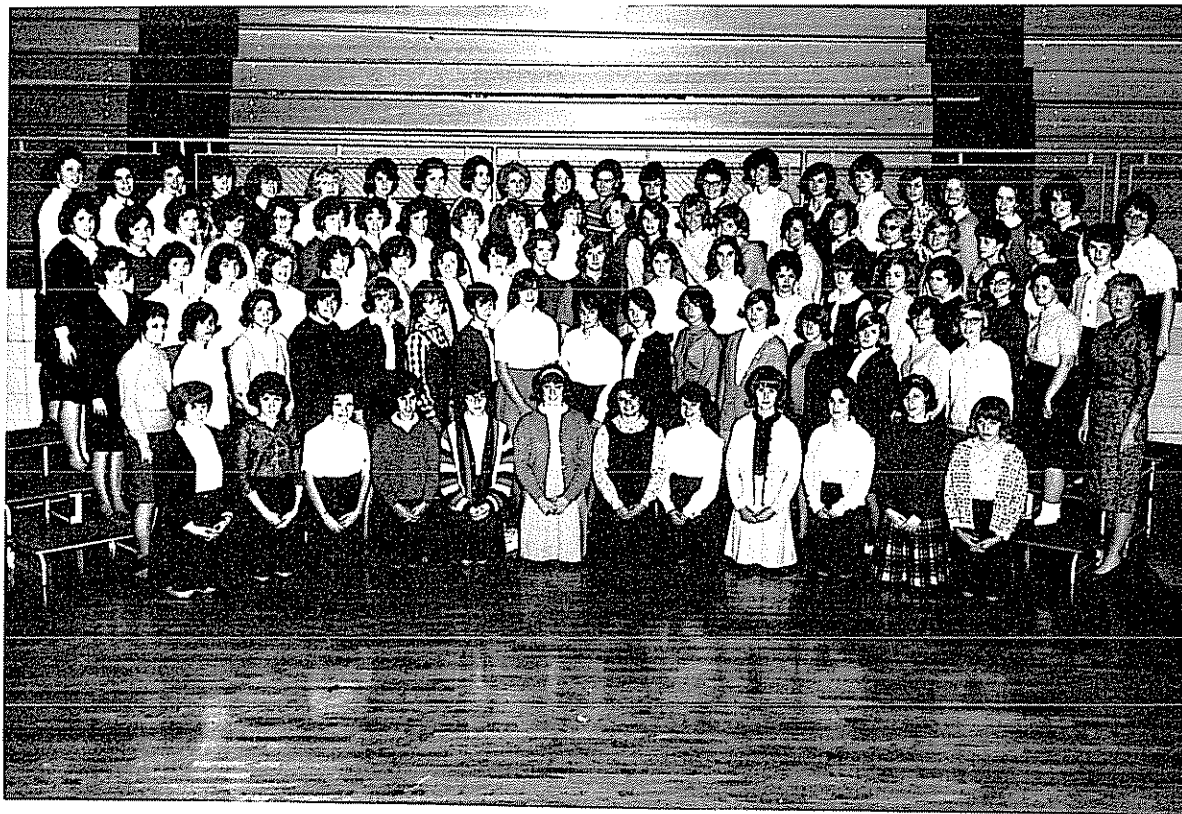

The German Club is under the sponsorship of Mr. Witsberger. The club has a cultural interest in Germany and conducts its meetings in German.

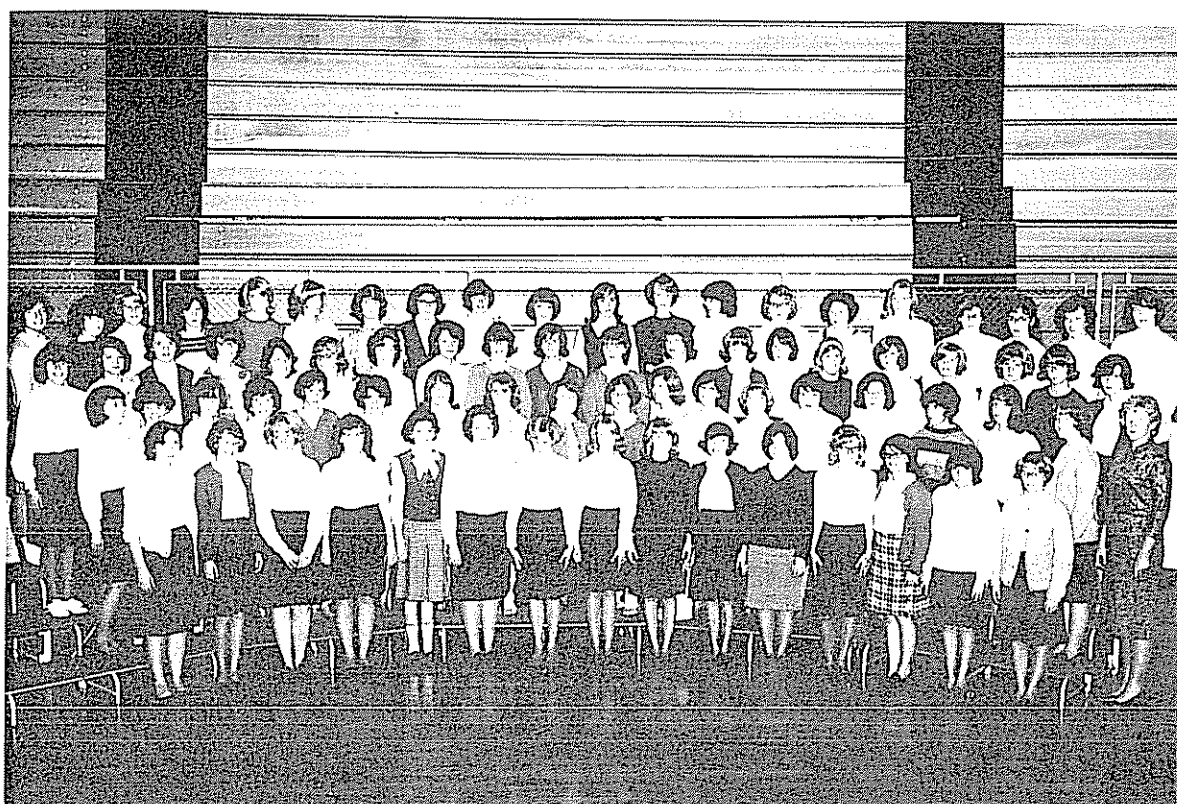


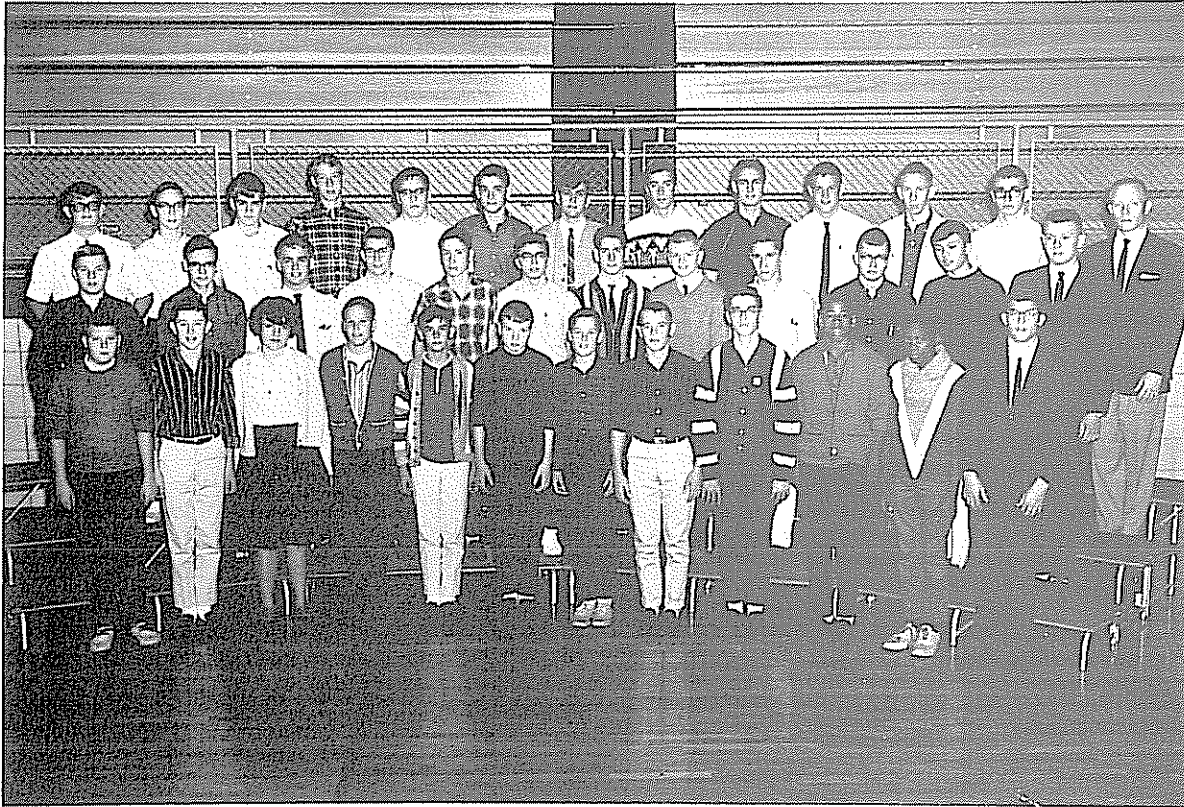

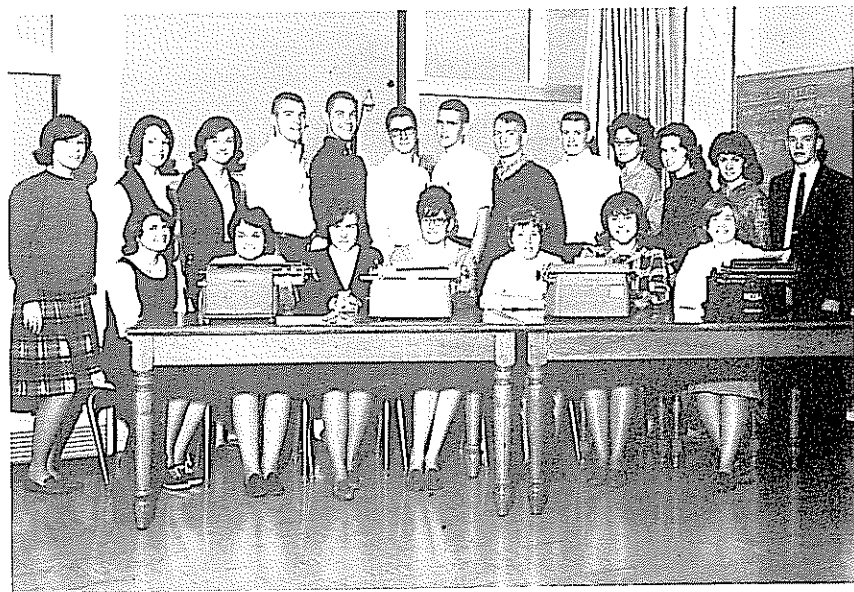
